

E- Visualise -INFOGRAPHICS

An **infographic poster** is a visual representation that presents information in a compelling and easily digestible format.

Infographic posters aim to convey complex information using engaging visual elements such as icons, graphs, charts, and stylish fonts.

A well-crafted title evokes curiosity, making it easier for the audience to engage with the content.

Effective headers include a title, a subtitle, and a logical flow of information, Icons, illustrations, and colour schemes enhance understanding and retention.

Ample white space ensures readability and prevents visual clutter.

Who can present?

This category is open only to undergraduate students.

What can be presented?

You can present topics learnt about Autism so far, or any new knowledge gained, updates, evidence based new trends and therapy methods. Can include info on non-clinical aspects like parent support, government schemes etc also with regard to care for children with Autism.

GUIDELINES TO PREPARE E-VISUALISE

- Use Times New Roman font with a font size of 24 in the slides. Ensure that the graphs/tables are readable.
- The header should have the name of the conference <u>8^{rth} Annual</u> <u>NICE Conference on AUTISM</u>

Preparing your Content

The header should have the name of the conference – <u>8^d Annual NICE</u> <u>Conference on AUTISM</u> and the footer should have

- 1. The title and name of the author (s) should appear at the top of the poster with not less than font size 18
- 2. Use a clear typeface and, if possible, a laser printer. The infographics should be readable from a distance of 2-3 meters. This means that all lettering should be at least 8mm high, with a minimum font size of 24.
- 3. figures should be readable from a distance of 2-3 meters. They should be drawn with a minimum line width of 1 mm.

SELECTION:

- 1. Our scientific committee will choose the top three presentations.
- 2. Winners will receive the rewards during the Valedictory.
- 3. All submissions become the property of NICE AUTCON and will be shared in digital, print media and social platforms with due credits to the original submission.
